CALL TO ORDER – QUORUM; Pledge of Allegiance, Mission/Vision Statement – The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Dr. Hornak gave opening statement. He wanted to take time to highlight and celebrate all the incredible things happening across the district. From classroom achievements to community initiatives. There is much to be proud of at Holt Public.

CHANGES/ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA – There were the following changes to the agenda. Moved item 8.2.3 up on the agenda to just after item 3.1 Student Spotlight agenda item. We will be removing items 8.1, 8.3, 8.4, 9.1 as they were covered in the Committee of the Whole meeting.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT - Cast, Crew, and Advisors from the HHS Production of Cinderella. Had 60 students involved and the most technical program. Cinderella had 1646 patrons in attendance over the two-weekend run. This is the most in the history of the school. Students and advisors from the production were on hand and sang a song from the production. It was amazing!

Second Read Weighted GPA* - IT WAS MOVED by Trustee Robel and supported by Trustee Perry to approve adding a weighted GPA to High School transcripts. The weighted GPA will be calculated using the criteria provided by the Curriculum Office on November 11, 2024, and will not be used for other Holt Public Schools purposes such as Top Ten, 3.5 Awards, Valedictorian, Salutatorian, etc. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Scott House – Thank you for all you do. I want to begin by sharing how awesome it was to hear the students from Cinderella sing tonight. I came here as a parent to support the weighted GPA issue. I appreciate your support of this.

Jim Hafke – I have emailed all of you my position on the weighted GPA issue. Thank you for what you just did. I'm here as a parent, long-time member of the Holt Community and volunteer coach. I became passionate about this issue because of something that happened to my son. As a coach I also interact with many students and families who cannot afford to not have a weighted GPA. By your action a lot of young people in our community will have an easier and more affordable option for going to college. Thank you.

Kristy Taylor – Parent, Substitute Teacher and Environmental Outreach coordinator. I am here to thank you for your support of the high school nest box project which went installed last year. I also want to give you information on the health and productivity of our natural spaces. I would love to see Michigan native trees, wildflowers and shrubs planted at our new buildings. They can be supported by grants. The gardens provide classroom learning environments. Thank you.

Richard Runnels – I live on Jarvis Hwy. There is no shoulder whatsoever. Two years ago, I witnessed a bus almost lose it and told the director they were running way too fast. I saw a bus going at least 50 miles per hour. We cannot post a speed limit sign of 25 mph due to the lack of driveways. He would like to have HPS address this and make the buses slow down on Jarvis. He feels 25 mph is even too fast on Jarvis. He is hoping you can address this. It is too fast, and I don't want to see anyone hurt.

Ella Reaves – I prepared a speech on weighted GPAs. Students at HPS are all positively impacted by this decision. Thank you for what you did tonight.

Mark Sandberg - I also prepared a speech. Thank you for making the change. For my daughter it is an extra \$12,000 and I appreciate what you did tonight.

Lucy Prush - I would like to say we should use the weighted GPA for Top 10, valedictorian, salutatorian and I don't think it is fair that we have less challenging course work and be weighted the same as gen-ed / easy class work.

Jacqueline Wood – I am not here for weighted GPA. I am a community member. I was a school board member for 21 years. It took a lot to come here tonight. I have had a lot of negative experiences over the * Requires Board action

past few years. I have been denied access the last couple of years in school buildings and have been told I could not bring visitors in in because they were getting ready to open. This year I wanted to bring a Japanese delegation, we met with mayors, and the governor. I was told we would not be able to visit without a background check. I think this is interesting since I came to the play and there are no background checks. I called Wilcox and Traci was wonderful there. I have a class from the Class of 1965. They want to come on a Friday when there are no students present. I set up a zoom for with a Finnish company to incorporate STEM and wanted to do a Zoom call. I called the Superintendent's Office, and they referred me to Curriculum. No one called me back. This was a lost opportunity.

President Dalton stated that she would like to connect with Ms. Wood to make sure we connect on the issues you are bringing forward.
